Opportunities for Producers

Film Australia Digital Learning develops and produces several projects a year, working with independent producers and new media developers.

It aims to create opportunities for new and established documentary filmmakers to develop skills and gain experience in producing educational programming. Digital Learning projects are currently developed for online delivery and/or DVD. All projects will have direct curriculum relevance for Australian secondary schools.

Access to Film Australia's Library

Digital Learning projects draw on Film Australia's archive of over 5000 films and over 100,000 still photographs, from the late 19th century to the present day, including material produced under the **National Interest Program (NIP)**.

The aim of all Digital Learning projects is to give educators and students quick and easy access to video clips and images from this unique record of Australian life.

As Film Australia owns and manages copyright in this collection, Digital Learning productions can license archival material free of charge.

Film Australia Digital Learning Online

Film Australia Digital Learning is the gateway to Film Australia's online educational resources. This website portal provides the access to websites produced under both the Digital Learning and the NIP, as well as downloadable teachers notes, TV schedules for educational off-air copying and online ordering of Film Australia's videos and DVDs.
